Construction update

The Australian and NSW governments are investing in an upgrade to the Princes Highway and Jervis Bay Road intersection at Falls Creek.

What work are we doing?

During October, work will continue including:

- placing 11 pre-cast super-T girders to form the bridge deck
- partially opening the new eastern roundabout on Jervis Bay Road (affected residents will be notified separately)
- installing safety barriers and guard rails on the bridge
- ongoing major earthworks and importing material to continue building embankments
- revegetation as work areas are completed
- installing new streetlighting and traffic monitoring systems
- building the southbound off ramp
- bridge abutment, deck and parapet construction
- continuing new drainage installation across the site
- kerb construction
- building road surfaces on parts of the Princes Highway, Jervis Bay Road, Old Princes Highway and Willowgreen Road
- installing and/or relocating safety barriers and signage

When we'll be working

From Wednesday 1 to Friday 31 October 2025 our standard work hours will be Monday to Friday between 7am and 6pm, and on Saturdays between 8am and 1pm, weather permitting.

Night work will be carried out for up to 10 nights each month between 6pm and 6am (work may continue in off road work areas until 7am), with the following nights scheduled for work:

- Wednesday 1 October 2025
- Wednesday 8 and Thursday 9 October 2025
- Monday 13, Wednesday 15, Thursday 16
 October 2025
- Sunday 19, Wednesday 22 and Thursday 23
 October 2025
- Thursday 30 October 2025.

If work is delayed by weather or operations, contingency work may be carried out on

Thursday 2, Monday 20, Tuesday 21, Sunday 26, Monday 27, Tuesday 28 or Wednesday 29 October 2025.

We will keep the community informed of any changes.

Temporary traffic changes

During work hours there will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work area is safe. Lane and shoulder closures and reduced speed limits of 60 km/h or 40 km/h may be in place on the Princes Highway, Old Princes Highway, Jervis Bay Road, Willowgreen Road and Gardner Road.

Some of the road surface, girder installation, signage and barrier work will be done during night

to minimise impacts to road users during peak times, resulting in lane closures where vehicles will be directed under traffic control.

Detours will be in place for a section of Jervis Bay Road for some work activities. Specific work dates and all related detour information will be provided to the community separately.

Boom gates will be in place at the intersection of the Princes Highway and Jervis Bay Road to assist with increased school holiday traffic between 9am and 5pm on Friday 26 September, Thursday 2 to Saturday 4 October, Monday 6 and Friday 10 October 2025.

Road users are advised to drive to conditions and follow the directions of signs and traffic control, taking extra care when boom gates are in operation.

During nightwork, road users are advised to allow an extra five minutes' travel time.

What will this mean for you?

Some activities need to be carried out at night to minimise traffic disruptions and reduce safety risks to our workers and road users.

We will not work more than two consecutive nights in the same area.

Our work may be noisy at times and there may be construction lighting in use, however we will do everything we can to minimise these impacts. This includes using non-tonal reversing beepers on equipment, turning machinery and lighting off when not in use, and carrying out noisier works early during the night shift.
