


Kamay Wharves

La Perouse landside work update

June 2025





Transport for NSW acknowledges the Gweagal and Bidjigal people as the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respect to Elders past and present.

The NSW Government has replaced the previous ferry wharves at La Perouse and Kurnell as part of the Kamay Botany Bay National Park, Kurnell Master Plan.

Final landside work at La Perouse

At La Perouse, fencing around our compound has been in place while we finish work to re-grass the area.

As outlined in a previous notice, last year we found small pieces of pre-existing bonded asbestos in our landside work zone. These were safely removed, but this caused delays in completing the landscaping at La Perouse.

Our delivery partner, Fulton Hogan, will start work to re-grass the area on **Monday 23 June 2025**. This will take around **four weeks** to complete.

The fencing will remain in place for an **additional month** or so after this to let the grass establish before reopening the area to the public.

All work activities and dates are subject to weather and site conditions.

What work are we doing?

Some key activities you will see include:

- removing the temporary gravel surface layer that was installed at the start of construction within the compound area
- · laying down new soil and grass
- watering the new grass (for up to three months after it has been placed)
- removing the fencing and opening the area to the public (by early September).

During our work you may notice:

- a variety of equipment including an excavator, bobcat, material delivery trucks and worker vehicles
- temporary removal of around four parking spaces in front of the compound entrance to allow our equipment and vehicles to access the area (these spaces will be reinstated once work is finished).

Managing our impacts

- Pedestrian access will be maintained with safety measures such as signs and traffic controls to direct pedestrians and vehicles.
- Work areas will be secured, and our delivery partner will carry out work in line with the Construction Environmental Management Plan and sub-plans, including noise monitoring during certain activities.
- If we find any more asbestos material, we'll stop all relevant work near the discovery and manage it according to the unexpected finds procedure.

- 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday
- 8am to 1pm, Saturday

There will be no construction work on Sundays or public holidays.



Staying safe at the wharves

It's great to see people enjoying the new wharves. For your safety, and the safety of those you are supervising, please follow the signs.

Some key things to remember:

- jumping, diving, climbing on structures, or swimming is not allowed from any part of the wharf
- life rings, ladders and fire extinguishers are located on each wharf for use in emergencies only
- responsible fishing is allowed from the wharves, with two areas on each wharf featuring a lowered handrail designated for accessible fishing
- we ask bike users to please dismount and push your bike on the wharf
- Transport cleans the wharves daily, but we need your help – please use the bins provided

- and practice clean and respectful fishing (follow the fishing rule signs on the wharves)
- in case of emergency, please phone '000'. If you need non-urgent Police assistance, please contact Police on '131 444' (24 hours/ 7 days a week).
