## **Project update**

July 2025





Transport for NSW acknowledges the Gadigal people as the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respect to Elders past and present.

## Construction of the King Street Cycleway is continuing between Clarence Street and York Street.

Work is progressing well on King Street with traffic light relocations now complete.

Night work will continue throughout July, with the addition of weekend work to start widening the road for the cycleway.

#### **Upcoming Night work**

We will continue working on Sunday to Thursday from **8pm** and **5am** between Clarence and York Streets. Noisier work will be completed before midnight.

#### Weekend work from Friday 25 July

We will be completing weekend work from **8pm** Friday **25** July to **5am Monday 28** July, on King Street between Clarence Street and York Street (weather permitting).

On **Friday night** from **8pm** until **8am Saturday** we will be completing noisier work such as saw cutting, concrete work and jackhammering. We will also be excavating the road, pouring concrete and completing road resurfacing. During daytime hours, we will continue saw cutting, excavation and concrete work.

On **Saturday night** from **11pm** to **Sunday 10am** we will be jackhammering, saw cutting, continuing concrete work and completing road reinstatement.

On **Sunday night** from **7pm** to **Monday 5am**, there will be intermittent noisy work to reinstate the road and complete general site clean-up.

Our activities include:

- Excavating
- · Jackhammering and saw cutting
- Concrete work
- Road resurfacing

Working continuously across the weekend will allow us to complete essential work while minimising our impact to the community and road users during the week.

#### What will this mean for you?

We'll be using machinery such as jackhammers, saw cutters, excavators, concrete trucks, compactors, and lighting towers.

Work will be carried out continuously however, it will be staged to manage impacts to the surrounding community.

You may notice:

- Traffic controllers and signage
- Pedestrians and motorists should follow advice from traffic control who will guide road users and pedestrians safely around the work area.
- Lane closures between Clarence and York Streets.

#### Managing our impacts


Our work requires the use of machinery that generates noise, light and vibration. To manage this, we'll implement a range of measures such as turning off machinery when not in use, installing noise reducing blankets around construction sites and fitting equipment with devices to minimise noise.
