

Work continuing at Medlow Bath from Saturday 1 February

Medlow Bath Upgrade
January 2025



Transport for NSW pays respect to the Darug and Gundungurra people as the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respects to Elders past and present.

Work is progressing on the Medlow Bath Upgrade with the project on track to be finished in mid 2025.

When and where we'll be working

Work is taking place across the project site, see a summary of activities provided below. Please note, work is weather dependant and we have been amending our program accordingly.

Great Western Highway and Bellevue Crescent:

- switching traffic at the Katoomba end of the project onto westbound lanes of the Highway
- continuing construction on Bellevue Crescent
- moving the pedestrian refuge on the Highway about 60m towards Katoomba
- general earthworks, pavement, drainage, and landscaping work
- utility works including relocating/installing power poles, noting a more detailed notification will be issued to impacted residents ahead of this work
- constructing the shared path and driveways
- moving barriers and linemarking to realign traffic.

Railway Parade:

- minor utility work
- verge earthworks and landscaping
- constructing the sediment basin.

Station Upgrade works:

- constructing the pedestrian bridge, stairs, lifts and station services
- large vehicles will be accessing the rail corridor from Railway Parade during the 22-23 February weekend railway possession.

We will be working from **7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday** and **Saturday from 8am to 4pm**.

Weather has impacted our work program and we expect to carry out **nightwork** for up to 6 shifts per month in February and March, weather permitting.

Dates for this work will be notified to affected residents with details of work locations, activities and likely impacts.

Nightwork hours will be between 6pm and 7am on weekdays only.

Bus stop location changes

The temporary eastbound bus stop will continue to be in place at the u-turn bay on Railway Parade. The westbound bus stop will remain in it's temporary location as shown in the map over the page. Bus stops are expected to be in these locations until the end of March.

Bellevue Crescent temporary access

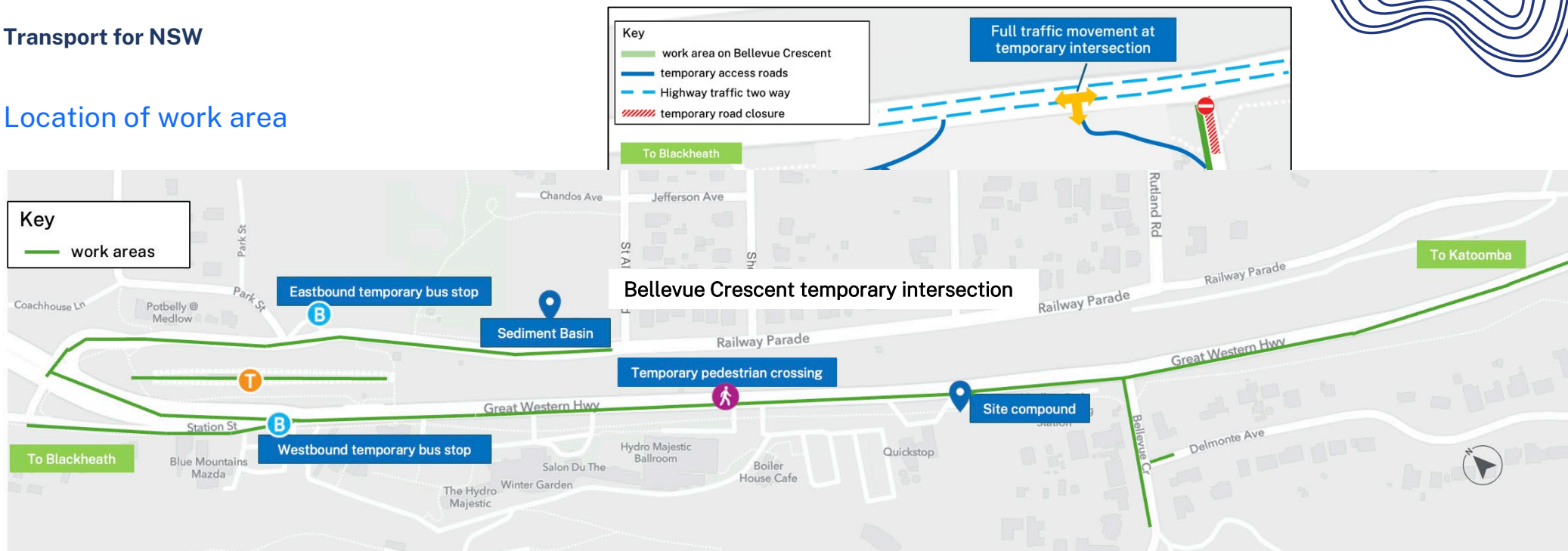
The temporary Bellevue Crescent intersection will remain in its revised format as work continues on the new signalised intersection on the Great Western Highway. Right turns in and out will be maintained at this temporary intersection while it is in place.

Managing our impacts

We aim to manage our work to avoid impacts to the community, residents and the environment. This includes maintaining pedestrian and property access, turning off machinery, installing noise blankets, liaising with affected residents and offering alternative accommodation.

Traffic control will be in place including stop/slow operations and a reduced speed limit of 40 km/h in some areas.
