



Moss Vale Station and Stabling Yard Upgrade

Community notification

June 2025



Transport for NSW acknowledges the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respect to Elders past and present.

The NSW Government is investing in an upgrade to Moss Vale Station and Stabling Yard to make the station more accessible and to accommodate the new Regional Rail fleet.

The project will achieve Disability Standards for Accessible Public Transport 2002 (DSAPT) compliance, providing a station precinct that is accessible to those with a disability, limited mobility, parents/carers with prams and customers with luggage, while ensuring it aligns with the community's transport needs.

What work are we doing?

Over the next month, we will continue carrying out construction and landscaping activities in and around the station and stabling yard, as well as on Argyle Street, Lackey Road and Dalys Way.

During this period we will be:

- continuing the upgrade of the pedestrian footpath and road works on Dalys Way
- continuing drainage on Dalys Way and around the Argyle Street lifts
- continuing noise wall installation and anti-graffiti treatment application
- upgrading the footpath and pedestrian crossing on Lackey Road
- cleaning the existing heritage wall on Lackey Road
- upgrading the stabling yard power and security systems

- carrying out train refuelling bay upgrades
- performing minor work to the platform buildings
- continuing planting and landscaping on Lackey Road, station courtyard, Dalys Way and around the Argyle Street lifts.

What does this mean for you?

As part of this work:

- there will be no vehicle or pedestrian access along Dalys Way, and no pedestrian access via the Lackey Road footbridge
- pedestrian access along Dalys Way will be reinstated in early June, weather permitting
- the station is accessible via Argyle Street footbridge and lifts
- Lackey Road will have intermittent traffic control with some temporary lane closures
- all buses will arrive and depart on Argyle Street near Leighton Gardens
- the commuter car park next to Diamond Jubilee Park will reopen in early June
- the station master's office work is complete with access via Platform 1
- the shuttle bus service will remain active while the Lackey Road footbridge remains closed.





Wingecarribee Shire Council, Transport for NSW, Challenge Southern Highlands, Degnan and three local schools took part in a tree planting event at Anembo Park on 8 May.

When will we be working?

Most work will take place during standard construction hours of **7am to 6pm Monday to Saturday**.

Out-of-hours work

We will be working at the station between **6am and 6pm on Saturday 7 June**. For the safety of staff and passengers, this work will take place during a scheduled Sydney Trains trackwork period when no trains are running, and the station is closed.

Temporary closure of Lackey Road footbridge

The Lackey Road footbridge and Dalys Way remains closed to vehicles and pedestrians to enable accessibility upgrades in this area.
