# Safety improvement work at Old South Head Road and Dover Road, Rose Bay from Sunday 2 March


## **Community Notification**

Transport for NSW acknowledges the Gadigal and Birrabirragal people as the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respect to Elders past and present.

Transport for NSW is improving pedestrian safety at the intersection of Old South Head Road and Dover Road, Rose Bay. This work is being completed as part of the Federal Road Safety Program.

Work will start from Sunday 2 March and be completed by Friday 28 March 2025.

## Federal Road Safety Program

The Federal Road Safety Program aims to improve safety and reduce crashes on NSW roads. The Pedestrian Protection Sub-Program aims to improve protection for vulnerable road users, particularly on urban footpaths, shared pathways, cycleways and road crossings.

Since 2020, the Australian and NSW governments have invested more than \$600 million into road safety projects across NSW as part of the Federal Road Safety Program.

## What work are we doing?

We will be upgrading the traffic signals on **Old South** Head Road at its intersection with Dover Road, Rose Bay. Please refer to the location map overleaf.

In October 2024 we completed the site investigations for this project, however we were unable to start construction in December as previously notified. We will now proceed with the planned safety improvements.

#### Our work will include:

- installing new arrow lanterns on existing posts to held on the red arrows
- allow pedestrians to cross safely while motorists are

- cutting into the road to access underground services
- restoring the road surface
- reinstating line marking at the intersection.

#### When and where we'll be working

We will be onsite for up to ten nights between Sunday 2 March and Friday 28 March 2025, weather and site conditions permitting.

Our work hours will be between 8pm and 5am from Sunday to Thursday.

We will not work on Fridays, Saturdays, or public holidays.

Our work needs to be carried out at night to minimise traffic disruption and reduce safety risks to workers and motorists.

If you have any concerns about our work schedule or the work activities, please contact our delivery partner, ConnectSydney, as detailed overleaf.

## What will this mean for you?

#### You may notice:

- workers and vehicles
- traffic controllers and signage
- lane closures and reduced speed limits
- pedestrian detours with traffic controllers on site to guide you
- noise from machinery and equipment.

## Managing our impacts

This includes:

- reducing our noise as much as possible
- turning off equipment when not in use
- positioning equipment away from homes and businesses
- completing noisier tasks by midnight.

### Temporary traffic changes 8pm-5am

- You may notice temporary traffic changes during work hours to ensure the work zone is safe.
- We will ensure access to properties in and near the work zone are maintained.
- Please keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs.
