Princes Highway, Moruya – safety and efficiency upgrades

Princes Highway Corridor safety and efficiency upgrades

Transport for NSW acknowledges the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respect to Elders past and present.

Transport for NSW (Transport) is delivering \$2.5 million of safety and efficiency upgrades on the Princes Highway at Moruya to improve safety, efficiency and traffic flow on this section of the highway.

What work are we doing?

We are extending the existing northbound overtaking lane on the highway by around 550 metres south of Malabar Drive. This will help improve traffic flow by increasing capacity on this section of the highway. It will also provide a safe option for motorists to pass slower vehicles, such as heavy vehicles and vehicles towing caravans.

We will also be upgrading the intersection at Malabar Drive to ensure it aligns with current road design standards. Shoulder widening will be carried out which will provide additional space for left-turning vehicles to safely exit the Princes Highway into Malabar Drive.

Work will also include:

- road widening to accommodate the additional overtaking lane and widened shoulders
- road surface and drainage improvements
- installing roadside flexible steel rail barriers
- reinstating the existing one-metre-wide centreline.

When and where we'll be working

We'll be working on the Princes Highway at Moruya, between Shelley Road and Malabar Drive, between **6am and 6pm weekdays** starting **Tuesday 2 September 2025** for up to three months, weather permitting.

What will this mean for you?

While work is under way, you may notice:

- · workers and vehicles in the area
- traffic controllers and signage
- lane closures and reduced speed limits
- noise from machinery and equipment.

Single lane closures, stop/slow traffic control and a reduced speed limit of 40 km/h will be in place for the safety of road users and our workers.

Road users should allow up to five minutes' additional travel time, drive to the conditions and follow the direction of signs and traffic control.


Managing our effects on the community
