



# Repairing flood damage to TF Kennelly Bridge at Cobargo

Transport for NSW will repair flood damage to the southern abutment at TF Kennelly Bridge over Narira Creek at Cobargo from next week.

### What work are we doing?

We will repair erosion damage to the structure's abutment embankments, which support the end of the bridge deck.

Work includes adding rock fill to stabilise the bridge embankments and make the bridge more resilient to future flood events.

### When and where we'll be working

We will be working from the carpark at the southern end of the bridge, near the intersection of Princes Highway and Wandella Road.

Work includes:

- establishing a temporary work site
- building an access track into the area
- placing rock scour protection beneath the bridge.

Work will be carried out from **Monday 4 August** for **eight weeks** and is expected to be completed by **end of September**, weather permitting.

Work hours are **Monday to Friday** between **7am and 5pm**.

### What will this mean for you?

There will be temporary impacts while we carry out this work.

We'll make every effort to minimise our impacts and complete work as quickly as possible.

You may notice:

- workers and vehicles
- traffic controllers and signage
- intermittent lane closures, stop/slow traffic control and a reduced speed limit
- noise from machinery and equipment.

Motorists are advised to allow an additional five minutes' travel time.
