



# Queanbeyan Station upgrade is complete

## Community notification

Transport for NSW acknowledges the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respect to Elders past and present.



Work has been completed on an accessibility upgrade at Queanbeyan Station.

The NSW Government has upgraded accessibility at Queanbeyan Station. This upgrade was delivered as part of the Safe Accessible Transport Program, an initiative that delivers a station precinct that is accessible to people with a disability, limited mobility, parents/carers with prams and passengers with luggage.

### Work is complete

We are pleased to announce that the accessibility upgrade at Queanbeyan Station is complete.

We carried out consultation with the community and key stakeholders, which helped us deliver:

- a new accessible ramp, footpath and stairs
- a new pedestrian crossing through the station car park
- upgraded landscaping, relocating the existing palm tree in the station car park and widening the footpath
- resurfaced car park
- regraded platform and station pavement
- a new accessible parking space, bus/coach drop-off and kiss-and-ride zone
- a new boarding assistance zone
- new bicycle parking in the forecourt
- a new family accessible toilet
- new accessible seating and allocated waiting spaces for wheelchair users on the platform and in the forecourt
- upgraded lighting, wayfinding and closed-circuit television (CCTV) around the station precinct.

## Thank you for your contributions

Key stakeholders and members of the community shared their experiences of accessibility at Queanbeyan Station before plans were finalised.

We considered this feedback as part of the detailed design process for the station upgrade, which helped us deliver a station that works for the community.

## Heritage is a key element

We were careful to keep in mind the heritage status of Queanbeyan Station, which is listed on the State Heritage Register and the S170 Register.

All elements of heritage significance were retained as part of this project, and any impacts to the heritage value

have been negligible.

Work began at Queanbeyan in December 2024 and was completed in nine months. Steps were taken to ensure commuters and our workers were kept safe for the duration of the upgrade.
