



Safety improvement work at Queen Street and Moncur Street, Woollahra

Transport for NSW is improving pedestrian safety at the intersection of Queen Street and Moncur Street, Woollahra. This work is being completed as part of the Road Safety Program.

Work will start from **Sunday 20 July** and be completed by **Friday 24 October 2025**.

Road Safety Program

The Australian and NSW governments are investing \$518 million to improve safety and reduce crashes on NSW roads as part of the Road Safety Program launched in 2024.

What work are we doing?

We will be upgrading the traffic lights on **Queen Street** at its intersection with **Moncur Street, Woollahra**. Please refer to the location map overleaf.

Our work will include:

- installing new arrow lanterns on traffic lights to allow pedestrians to cross safely while motorists are held on the red arrows
- cutting into the road and footpath to upgrade traffic signals cabling. The excavated surfaces will be restored after work is complete
- replacing the traffic light controller cabinet
- upgrading the line marking.

When and where we'll be working

We will be onsite for up to **22 nights** between **Sunday 20 July** and **Friday 24 October 2025**, weather and site conditions permitting.

Our work hours will be between **8pm** and **5am** from **Sunday** to **Thursday**.

We will not work on Fridays, Saturdays, or public holidays.

Our work needs to be carried out at night to minimise traffic disruption and reduce safety risks to workers and motorists.

If you have any concerns about our work, please contact our delivery partner, ConnectSydney, as detailed over the page.

What will this mean for you?

You may notice:

- workers and vehicles
- traffic controllers and signage
- lane closures and reduced speed limits
- pedestrian detours with traffic controllers on site to guide you
- noise from machinery and equipment.

Managing our impacts

We appreciate that road works can be disruptive to the surrounding community, and we will take care to minimise our impact where we can.

This includes:

- reducing our noise as much as possible
- turning off equipment when not in use
- positioning equipment away from homes and businesses
- completing noisier tasks by midnight.

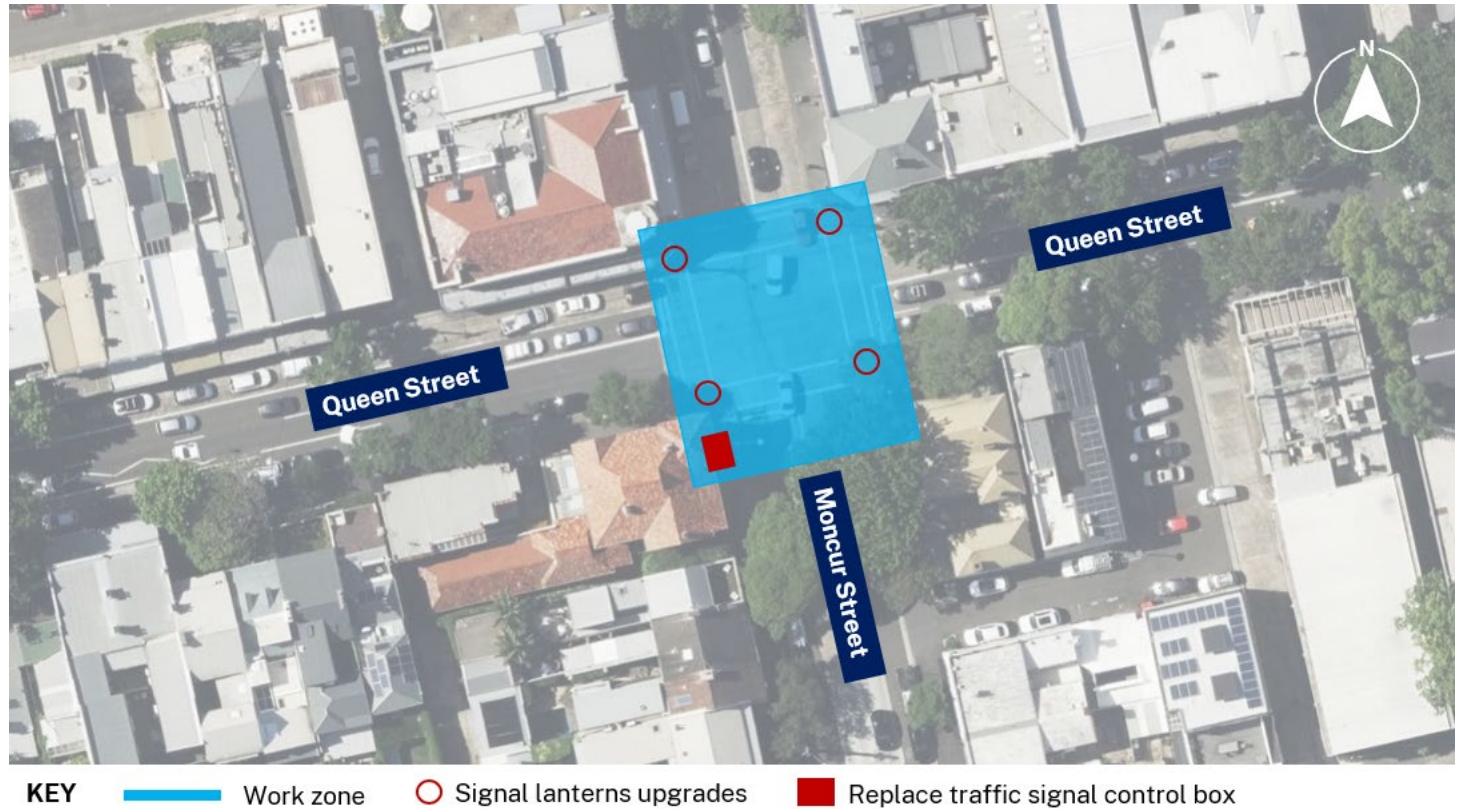


Temporary traffic changes
