# Banksia Station Upgrade NSW

Transport for NSW has improved accessibility at Banksia Station. The upgrade is now complete and provides a station precinct that is accessible to people with a disability or limited mobility, parents/carers with prams and customers with luggage.

#### **Project completion**

The community is now able to use the station's new and improved accessibility features, including:

- three new lifts to the station platforms
- improvements to the existing underpass
- new kiss and ride area and accessible parking space on Hattersley Street
- upgrades to CCTV, lighting and wayfinding signage
- modification of the existing station building on Platform 2 and 3 to provide unisex accessible toilets and a family accessible toilet
- regrading sections of the platforms
- additional platform canopy coverage on platforms 2, 3 and 4.

The project was completed as part of the Transport Access Program, a NSW Government initiative to provide a better experience for public transport customers by delivering accessible, modern, secure and integrated transport infrastructure.
